Reconnecting Venue Hirers

Our Centre was recently successful with a Hobsons Bay City Council 'Make It Happen Grants Program'.

The grant will support our venue hirers, who suffered financially last year due to the lockdown, and found it difficult to re start and continue to deliver their programs into 2021.

We have subsidised all rental fees for term one 2021, for all 2020 private venue hirers who continued with us into this year (Excluding government funded, supported, peak bodies, large private, etc.).

This will ensure that many local small service providers will get support, programs will continue and remain sustainable, local people will be re engaged in activities, funds from savings may be used to support local suppliers and shops in Hobsons Bay, or possibly reduced fees for local participants.
