

We will also be re cabling our whole IT infrastructure throughout Joan Kirner House.



From Rita, one of our Skills for Education and Employment (SEE) class teachers.

"Virun and some of her family members migrated from Cambodia.

When she arrived in Australia, she began to learn English and completed the 510 hours of the Adult Migrant English Program.

Then, she started working as a cook at a Thai restaurant in Williamstown.

After long years of hard work Virun was able to buy a house in Williamstown.

Unfortunately, the restaurant closed in 2018 and Virun started to receive New start allowance from Centrelink.



She was then referred to Williamstown Community Education Centre (WCEC) and started to learn English as part of the SEE Program.

Virun was a very active member of the class and worked very hard to improve her language skills.

She made the most of every opportunity to learn English. Meantime, she continued to search for a job.

She often thought her age (she is in her 50's) was an impediment to gaining employment.

However, in July 2019 Virun found a job in a bakery-café in Melton.

She attended the job interview and accepted the position to work full time. Initially, she was a bit worried about the long drive on the Highway.

After a few nervous drives Virun started to feel more confident as a driver.

At the moment, she is missing the WCEC students, friends and staff. However, she is happy with her new life, her job, her income and the independence of being employed.

Update - Parking at Joan Kirner House

Our ongoing campaign to have reserved parking for our Centre users on the Cecil street frontage of Joan Kirner House...

The good news and the bad news.

First the bad news...

On Monday November 4 we met with Matthew Irving, Manager Capital Works from Hobsons Bay City Council who is compiling a report for Council.

Unfortunately, he said he would recommend to Council in their December Meeting that we **not** receive reserved parking on Cecil Street frontage.

The rationale is this -

- Our request was initially denied as it set a precedent for organisations, businesses or anyone else to get reserved parking.
- We highlighted that a precedent had already been set. For example, Kids by the Bay in Hanmer St Williamstown, Laverton Hub on Railway Ave, etc.
- Council then determined that these parking spaces should never have been approved and they are going to take these signs away including our current reserved parking on Thompson Street.

However, Matthew did suggest that the Council will look at extending the two hour parking on Cecil and Thompson streets to five hour parking.

The good news...

We highlighted to Matthew that another option could be permits for the actual vehicles, where staff have stickers that allows them to park for longer than the two hour restricted time, and students can get a visitors permit from reception, to hang on their mirror for the time they are parked.

Matthew recognised that this is a very common precedent throughout Hobsons Bay and that we should be provided with this as well.

So, we put an application to Council to get these permits and we were successful.

Many thanks to Matthew Irving from Council who had the foresight and ideas, as well as the support to resolve this long running concern.

Issue resolved!

We had our Victoria Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA) site audit on November 27 and 28.

Always a stressful time, however to our complete delight we came out 100 percent compliant across all AQTF Conditions and Standards as well as all VRQA Guidelines.

The Auditor informed us that in her nine years of being a VRQA / ASQA Auditor, that we are only the second training organisation she had found to be completely and totally compliant.
