Preschool Piano with Kerry offers a fun an education introduction to piano for children aged 3 to 5. In small groups of 4 to 6 children this 9-week program, will lay the foundation for a bright musical future in piano or other instruments.



Our new *Health My Way* initiative is a Good Things Foundation program supported by the Australian Digital Health Agency.

Four million people in Australia have limited digital skills, however 22 million Australians now have an online summary of their health information on the My Health Record.

Now she is employed full time at Explorer Early Learning Childcare Centre in Williamstown.

Reflections

At the end of year break we repainted Joan Kirner House childcare, the staff room, office, room six and the toilets.

We also received and set up 14 brand new iPads thanks to the *Tim Watts Stronger Communities* Program

As mentioned last year, with our Victoria Registration and Qualifications Authority site audit we came out fully compliant.

Highlights from the Final Report we received in January include -

- The RTO's training delivery, student services and management of operations were all of a very high level of compliance against the Standards.
- The RTO's training and assessment practices and the amount of training they deliver to students are strongly focused on the particular needs of their mostly CALD student cohort.
- The RTO's marketing materials are ethical, accurate and consistent with RTO's scope of registration.
- The RTO has strong set of policy and procedures and implements them consistently to support their compliance with the Conditions.
- Trainers and assessors have the necessary training and assessment competencies as determined by the National Quality Council or its successors and meet VRQA Guidelines.
- The RTO has extensive text and other resources for teacher and student use and a student library of English texts and reading.
- The RTO is linked to a range of community support services e.g., translation services, mediation services, counselling services, financial needs support, gambling support, emergency relief for food and accommodation.
- The RTO recognises the need for students to be supported to transition into Australian society so regular campus activities for students are held to help students engage with each other e.g. morning teas and BBQ lunches, and the community e.g. police visit.

- Students with disabilities are supported with appropriate equipment and learning resources, e.g. large print.
- The Quality Indicator student survey of 2019 showed the overall satisfaction was 85.2% in 2018 and 88.5% in 2019
- The RTO has monthly management meetings and the agenda and minutes showed that operations are reviewed regularly, and changes have been implemented.

Well done to all involved. Excellent job!
