How quickly the entire world has changed in just a few weeks.

As of Thursday 26 March, Spotswood Community House and Joan Kirner House are 'closed' to the public as a 'Community Centre'.

However, Joan Kirner House remains 'open' as a 'Learn Local', 'training organisation' and 'Childcare provider'.

Although hardly anyone is coming in anyway, nearly all programs have gone, no visitors, phones are dead quiet, students not turning up, minimal childcare.

We are still getting the place regularly cleaned.

In preparation for whatever happens, and to keep our organisation viable, we are organising some teaching staff to 'Work from Home', linking them to students, posting materials to students, looking at online options, etc.

This is working out well, and thanks to all teachers and admin staff involved, as we prepare for a possible complete shutdown.

I've been working with staff and contractors in the past few days, preparing and adjusting our work lives for what may lay ahead.

I thank all of you for being understanding.

Aside from health, hygiene, social distancing, etc, and the welfare of staff, an important task is to ensure the Centre survives.

By maintaining financial viability and keeping links with stakeholders, students, parents, staff, centre users, volunteers, sponsors, etc we can bounce back and rebuild after this crisis is over.

With Childcare, we have excellent bookings going into term two.

We are hopeful. However, with changes almost daily, there are no guarantees.

A big thanks also to all those kind people donating toilet paper, tissues, sanitiser, paper towels, etc.

Very much appreciated.

Thanks also to staff, volunteers, Committee, parents and Centre users for support, adherence to hygiene protocols and hard work over the past few weeks.
